An Act for Providing a Publick Reward for such Perfon or Persons as shall Discover the Longitude at Sea.



pereas it is well known by all that are acquainted with the Art of Mavigation, That nothing is so much wanted and desired at Sea, as the Discovery of the Longitude, for the Safety and Duickness of Advances, the Preservation of Ships and the Lives of Ben: And whereas in the Judgment of Able Bathematicians and Mavigators, several Pethods have already been Discovered, true in Theory, though very Discovered, true in Theory, though very Discoult in Pradice, some of which there

Is reason to expeat) may be capable of Improvement, some already Discovered may be proposed to the Publick, and others may be Invented hereafter: And whereas such a Discovery would be of particular Advantage to the Crade of Great Britain, and very much for the honour of this Kingdom; But besides the great Difficulty of the thing it felf, partly for the want of tome Publick Remard to be Settled as an Encourage. mene for so Aleful and Beneficial a Work, and partly for want of Doney for Trials and Experiments necessary thereunto, no fuch Inventions or Proposals, hitherto made, have been brought to Perfection; Be it therefore Enaded by the Queens most Excellent Bajesty, by and with the Avbice and Confent of the Lords Spiritual and Cemporal, and Commons in Parliament affembled, and by Authority of the fame, Chat the Logo Digh Admiral of Great Britain, or the first Commissioner of the Admiralty, the Speaker of the Donouvable Doule of Commons, the firs Commissioner of the Many, the fielt Commissioner of Crave, the Admirals of the Rev, Albite, and Blue Squabrong, the Maffer of the Trinity Poule, the President of the £3.1117 4 Cluuu 2 Ropal

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Royal Society, the Royal Aftronomet of Greenwich, the Savilian, Lucafian, and Plumian Poofeffogs of the Bathematicks in Oxford and Cambridge, all for the time being ; the Right Donoutable Thomas Carl of Pembroke and Montgomery, Philip Lord Bilhop of Hereford, George Lozd Bilhop of Briltol, Thomas Lozd Trevor, the Donourable Sir Thomas Hanmer Baronet, Spraker of the ponourable boufe of Commong, the ponourable Francis Robarts Efquire, James Stanhope Efquire, William Clayton Efg; . and William Lowndes Efquire, be Conffituted, and they are here. by Conflituted Commiffioners for the Discovery of the Longi. tude at Sea, and for Examining, Trying, and Judging of all Proposals, Experiments, and Improvements relating to the fame; And that the faid Commissioners, or any five or more of them, have full Power to Dear and Receive any Propofal or Proposals that that the made to them for Discovering the said Lengitude; And in cafe the faid Commissioners, or any five or more of them, thall be to far fatisfied of the Probability of any fuch Discovery, as to think it proper to make Experiment thereof, they hall Certifie the same, under their hands and Seals, to the Commissioners of the Davy for the time being, together with the Persons Mames who are the Authors of such Proposals. and upon producing such Certificate, the said Commissioners are bereby Authorized and Required to make out a Bill og Bills for any such Sum or Sums of Money, not exceeding Two thousand Pounds, as the faid Commissioners for the Discovery of the fair Longitude, or any five or more of them, shall think neceffary for making the Experiments, papable by the Treasurer of the May ; Which Sum or Sums the Treasurer of the May is hereby required to pay immediately to fuch Perfon or Perfons as thall be appointed by the Commissioners for the Discovery of the faid Longitude, to make those Experiments, out of any Money that thall be in his Dands, unapplied for the Ale of the Davp.

And be it further Enaced by the Authority aforelaid, That after Experiments made of any Proposal or Proposals for the Discovery of the said Longitude, the Commissioners appointed by this Ad, or the major part of them, shall Declare and Determine how far the same is found Pradicable, and to what Degree of

And for a due and lufficient Encouragement to any such Person or Persons as shall Discover a proper Nethod for Finding the said Longitude, Be it Enaked by the Authority aforesaid, That the First Author or Authors, Discoverer or Discoverers of any such Nethod, his or their Executors, Administrators, or Assgus, shall be Entitled to, and have such Reward as herein after is mentioned; That is to say, To a Reward, or Sum of Ten thousand Pounds, if it Determines the said Longitude to One Degree of a great Circle, or Sixty Geographical Piles; to Fisteen thousand Pounds, if it Determines the same to Ewo Thirds of that Dissance; and to Twenty thousand Pounds, if it Determines

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mines the same to One half of the same Distance; and that One Poiety of Pals-part of such Reward of Sum hall be Due and Pash, when the said Commissioners, of the major part of them, do Agree that any such Pethod extends to the Security of Ships within Eighty Geographical Piles of the Shores, which are Places of the greatest Danger, and the other Poiety of Pals-part, when a Ship by the Appointment of the said Commissioners, of the major part of them, shall thereby adually Sail over the Ocean, from Great Britain to any such Port in the West-Indies, as those Commissioners, of the major part of them, shall Choose of Mominate soft the Experiment, without Losing their Longitude beyond the Limits before mentioned.

And be it further Enaded by the Authority aforelatd, That as foon as such Bethod for the Discovery of the said Longitude thall have been Tried and found Pradicable and Afeful at Sea. within any of the Degrees aforelaid, That the laid Commissioners, or the major part of them, shall Certifie the same accordingly, under their hands and Seals, to the Commissioners of the Mayo for the time being, together with the Person or Persons Mames who are the Authors of such Propolal; and upon such Certificate the faid Commissioners are hereby Authorized and Required to make out a Bill or Bills for the respective Sum or Sums of Money, to which the Author or Authors of such Proposal, their Executors, Administrators, or Assigns, Mall be Entitled by virtue of this Ad; which Sum or Sums the Treasurer of the Many is hereby Required to Pay to the faid Author or Authors, their Executors, Administrators, or Alligns, out of any Honey that hall be in his hands, unapplied to the Ale of the Maby, according to the true Intent and Deaning of this Ad.

And it is hereby further Enaded by the Authority aforesaid, That if any such Proposal shall not, on Trial, be found of so great Ale, as aforementioned, yet if the same, on Trial, in the Judgment of the said Commissioners, or the major part of them, be found of considerable Ale to the Publick, That then in such case, the said Author or Authors, their Erecutors, Administrators, or Assigns, shall have and Receive such less Reward therefore, as the said Commissioners, or the major part of them, shall think reasonable, to be Paid by the Treasurer of the Nasy on such Certificate, as aforesaid.
